**On July 23rd is an event that is being cosponsored by at least 2 groups I know of at this time, namely, MoveOn and WACan. It is to be held at South Seattle Community College for 9am to 6pm. It is designed around 17 of the States selected by the Progressives Caucus to be states they wanted to "Listen to". We are one of those states and this event is being designed to help participants frame their needs into positive statements. I will find out more about this and see if I can invite some of you to attend. I think this may be a very important event if we do our homework right and have well designed statements. I did ask Rachel De Cruz from WACan to provide an online opportunity for people to write a statement if they are unable to attend. I also asked her to allow some of us to bring computers to we could "vote" on certain topics online in real time so we could tabulate responses very rapidly allowing us all to see what the issues are that are most worrisome for the attendees.

When I brought this up at the Outreach Committee meeting today, there was a great deal of skepticism about motivation. I want to keep a positive attitude about this until I find out more about it. I think the less someone else has to do with our messaging around health care, and the more responsibility we take, the better.
